Whiskey Flights

How our whiskey flight program works:

- Pick the flight or flights that best suit what you want to explore.
- You will receive three or four whiskey samples, a water dropper and a custom made tasting mat which will include a detailed brand description as well as tasting notes.
- Please don't just put water in to your whiskey without tasting it, water in whiskey is like salt in food, you're as likely to ruin it as you are make it better by adding what it doesn't need.
- Water will not make your whiskey better; it will only enhance the flavor that it already has, so if you don't like it without water you will like it even less with water added.
- Some tips on tasting whiskey, focus on three things:
 - Smell or Aroma:
 - You can easily go nose blind when smelling whiskey, if this happens, smell the inside of your elbow to reset your nose.
 - Also try to smell whiskey with your mouth open, to allow somewhere for the vapors to escape, and protect your nose.

o Taste:

It can be tough for your taste buds to recognize anything other than alcohol, try to refrain from drinking water in between every taste as this will only reset your mouth, like if you were eating something spicy.

o Finish and mouthfeel:

- This is how whiskey physically feels in your mouth and on the way down, try to notice how each feels different going down.
- Ask yourself if it creates a tingling sensation in your mouth, or if the warmth lingers anywhere on the way down, and where these things are happening. Each whiskey will feel different.
